Many 398th BG and 55th FG veterans and family members have donated original memorabilia from WWII.
Sunday 27th May	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Church service at St. George's Anstey: Beautiful 12th Century church with stained glass window with names inscribed of those 398th Bomb Group members killed in action while stationed at Nuthampstead. • American Air Museum and the Duxford Air Festival 2018: The museum tells the story of transatlantic collaboration between the UK and USA and houses the largest collection of American military aircraft outside the USA. The visit includes entry to the Imperial War Museum air show which features many vintage WWII aircraft.

See the chapel and visit the graves of our 398th BG KIA men. • Lunch at Coton Orchard Garden Centre: And shopping!
