### **Lists of Crews**

Item 11 above provides valuable information about crew makeup. However, it should be noted that these are “official” end of month crew lists that a crew member was assigned to. Throughout the month, a crew member probably flew most or all of their missions with that crew. However, there were regular crew substitutions due to illness or injury, etc. Thus the List of Crews is a good guide, but may not always be 100% accurate as to who was on the crew for missions within the month.


### **Availability**

This Statistical Report is prepared to give all members of this command a resume' of the operational accomplishments of this station for each month. It is prepared by the 398th Bombardment Group and deals, for the most part, with actual operational accomplishments of the Group, however, it must be realized that such accomplishments are possible only through the splendid cooperation and utmost effort of every man at this station. Hence this report is a resume' of the WAR EFFORT OF EVERY OFFICER AND SOLDIER AT THIS STATION.

This report covers the first operational month of this station. It is a report we may well be proud of, and one which I believe will compare favorably with a like report of the "First Month" of any group in this theatre of war.

It may be well to look back a little further even than this month in order to get the whole picture. On April 5th the Group Ground Echelon boarded trains at Rapid City, South Dakota and started its journey to war; two days later the Air Echelon started its flight in the same direction. On April 22nd, the first element of the Ground Echelon arrived at this station one half hour ahead of the first element of the Air Echelon. The Ground Echelon had been sailing the Atlantic for many days (To the discomfort and dismay of many); and the Air Echelon had been sweating out, and waiting out, the weather from the Dakotas to Hertfordshire. Upon arrival we found a group of officers and men who had been at this station a month or so preparing the Air Base for the Group. Everybody was glad to get together and start the job of getting this station ready for operations.

During the period of April 22nd to May 6th everyone was busy getting organized and oriented, and training in the ways of the ETO. We were all helped in a superior fashion by members of the Wing Staff and by members of the two older outfits in the Wing--many a pitfall was skirted and avoided through their combat-wise counsel.

The thirty first day after the Group started from South Dakota, and the fourteenth day after it arrived in England, a combat group of thirty six airplanes took off on the first operations from this station. Since then--take a look at this report!
